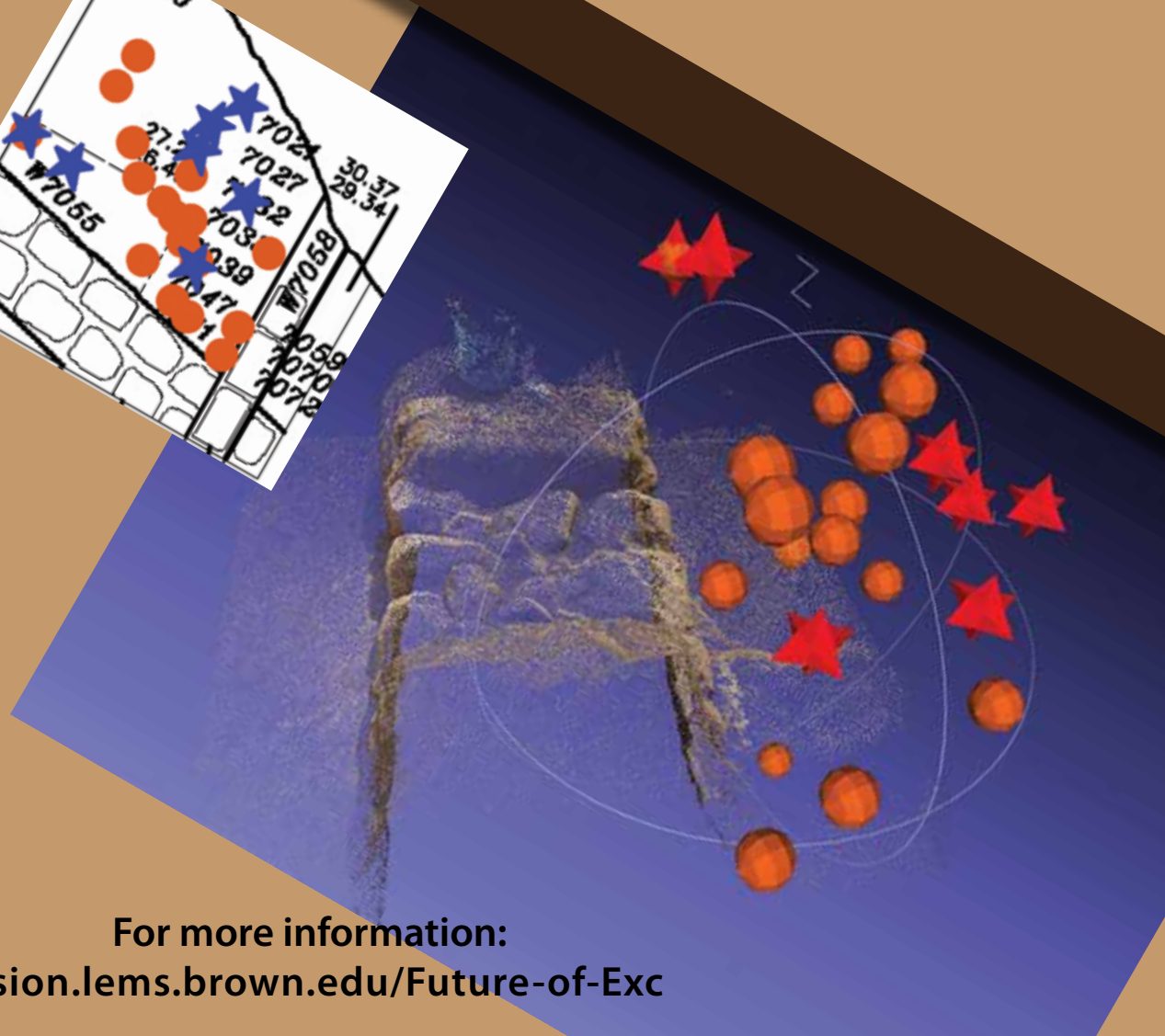
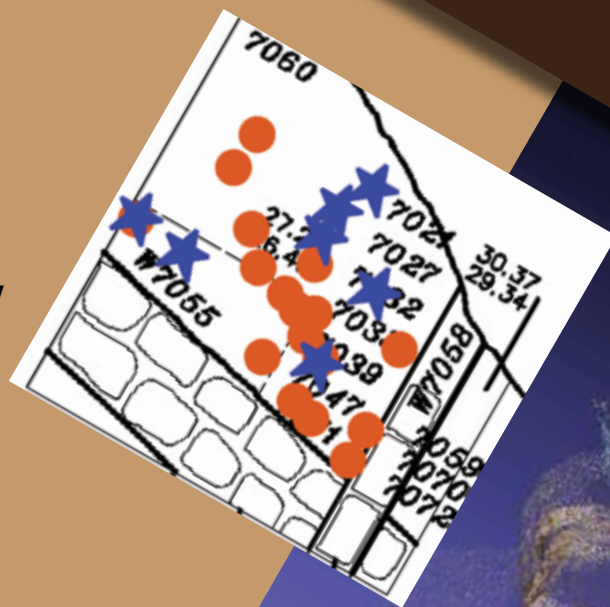

Brown University is hosting a symposium to introduce REVEAL, a paradigm-shifting software – being developed by a Brown University–led team through an NSF grant – that allows archaeologists to digitally record, visualize, and query all aspects of excavation progress and finds as a dig unfolds.
